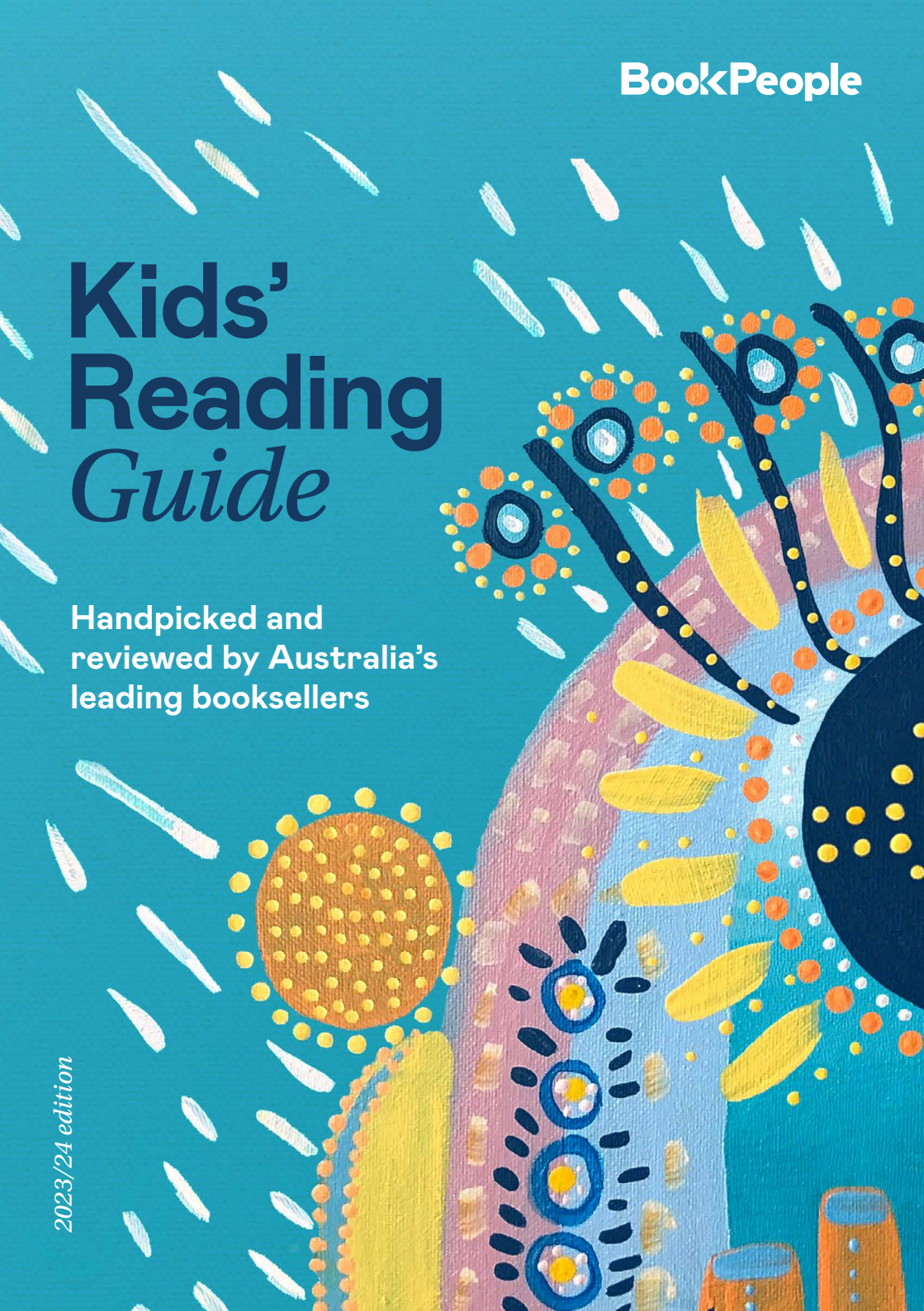

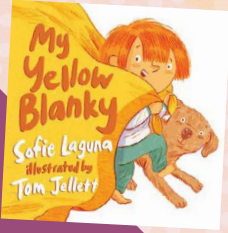


Giinagay Gaagal, Hello Ocean

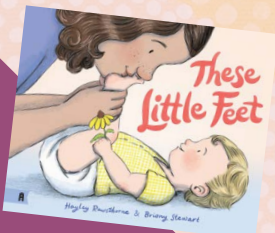

These Little Feet

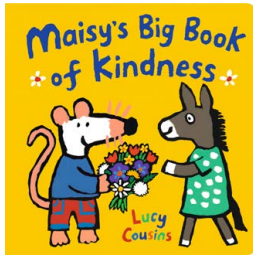
Hayley Rawsthorne and Briony Stewart (illus) | HB \$19.99

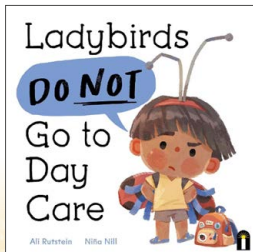

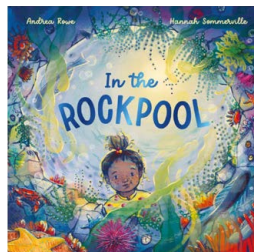


In The Rockpool

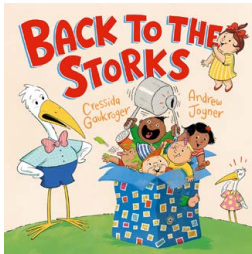


G.O.A.T.

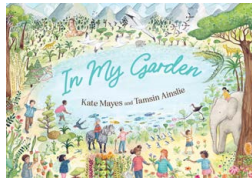


Back to the Storks

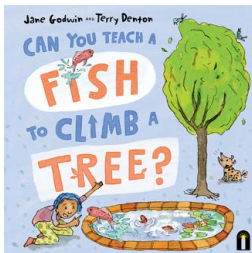


In My Garden

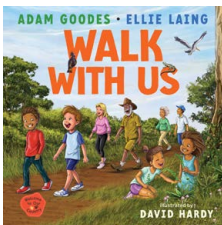


Mr Chicken Goes to Mars

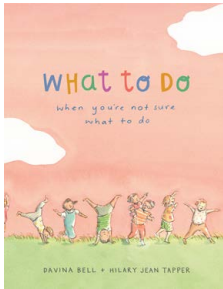
If I Was a Horse

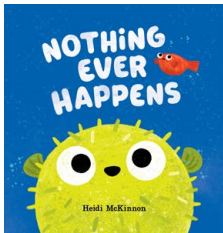


What to Do When You're Not Sure What to Do

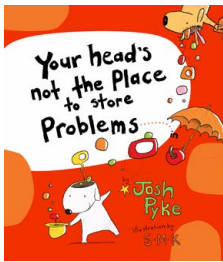


Nothing Ever Happens

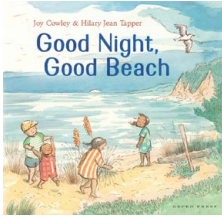


Always Never Always

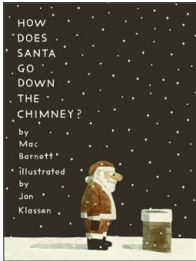




Good Night, Good Beach

Mac Barnett and Jon Klassen (illus) | HB \$27.99

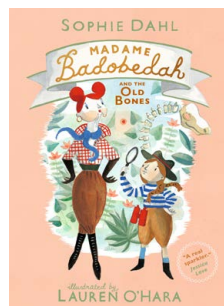

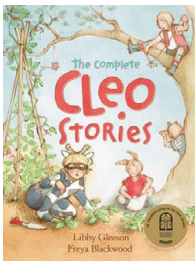


The Littlest Penguin and the Phillip Island Penguin Parade

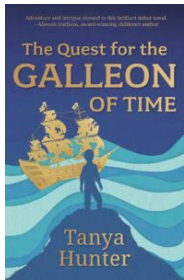


Kip of the Mountain

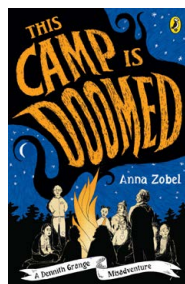


This Camp is Doomed: A Dennith Grange Misadventure

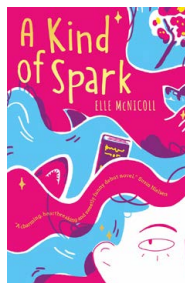

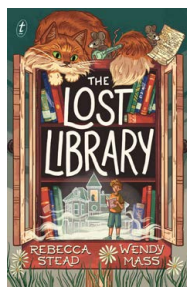

Sinead O'Hart | PB \$17.99

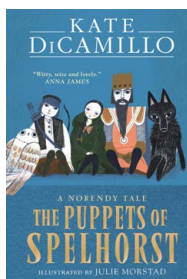

Rebecca Stead and Wendy Mass | PB \$16.99

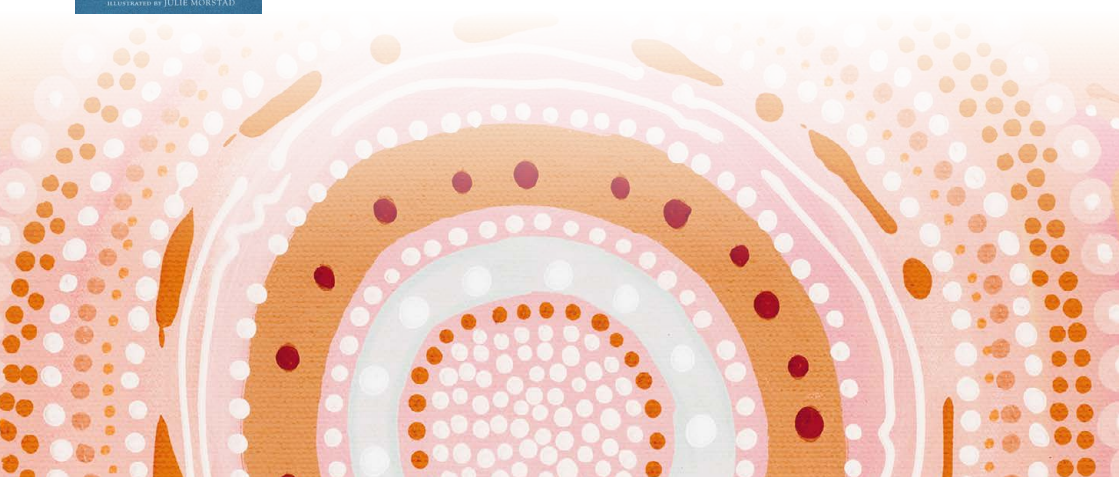

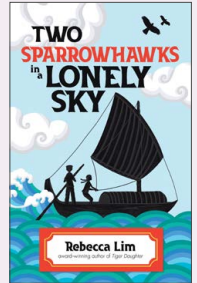

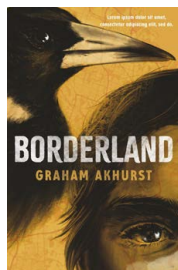


Secret Sparrow

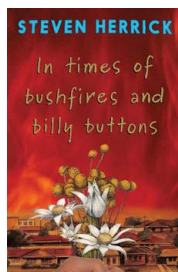


Borderland

Let's Never Speak of This Again

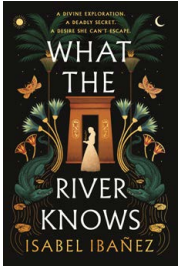
Megan Williams | PB \$24.99

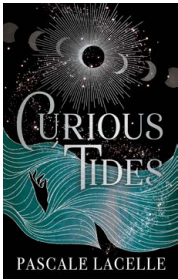




What the River Knows

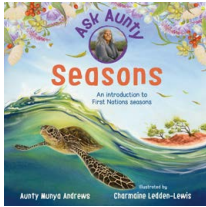
Heartstopper Volume 5

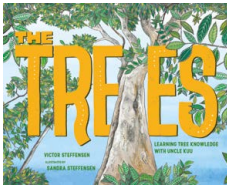


Ask Aunty: Seasons

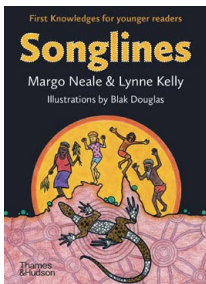


The Trees

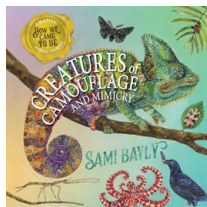

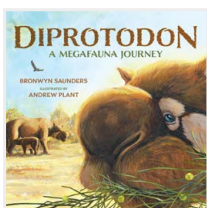


Diprotodon: A Megafauna Journey

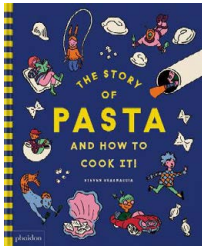
Artichoke to Zucchini
